Master's Internship Program Description

Counseling and Social Work Master's Students | Specialization in Child and Adolescent Therapy Be part of a highly supportive and exciting training opportunity!

Overview of Program

Smart Love Family Services is a not-for-profit agency that is located in the Logan Square neighborhood and in west suburban Oak Park. The clinical program provides outpatient mental health counseling to individuals of all ages that come from diverse backgrounds, with a specialization in child and adolescent treatment, parent counseling and parent education seminars. The agency also offers special programming to clients of color through our Minority Families Program and Health Equity Scholarship fund.

Training at SLFS presents the unique opportunity to learn and practice advanced relationship intervention skills. Meta-analysis on treatment outcome studies generally identify the therapeutic relationship at the center of change. Trainees will learn these skills through exposure to a relationship based psychodynamic treatment model based on the depth psychology, *Intrapsychic Humanism*® and parent guidance based on *Smart Love*®. No matter the orientation a student chooses to eventually practice, this training provides an excellent foundation in relationship intervention.

Training Opportunities and Responsibilities

The Master's Level Internship is a 20-24 hour per week/12 month internship to begin in July of the training year. All training will take place in the Oak Park office (which is easily accessible by the Metra train, and the Chicago L Green and Blue lines; free street parking or discounted garage parking nearby). Evening and Saturday hours required. Wednesdays is a mandatory training day.

The internship offers the following training opportunities:

- Carry an average caseload of 10-12 therapy clients presenting with a wide range of problems.
 - Primarily treat children and adolescents.
 - Opportunity to treat parents and adults
 - Possible opportunity to do child group therapy if occurring
- Additional internship hours (typically an average of 5-10 hours per week depending on caseload) outside of client hours and supervision may include:
 - Help with research (mostly data entry) to evaluate the efficacy of Inner Humanism psychotherapy and the Smart Love parenting approach
 - Participate in marketing and social media marketing
 - Participate in Minority Families Program by helping with various tasks
 - Involvement in program development activities, such as development of a social skills groups for children and adolescents, and other community collaboration projects as they become available
 - Attend up to 2 community fairs (typically on weekends) to represent SLFS in the community and help families learn about our services

Supervision and Consultation

- At least one hour weekly individual supervision with a licensed therapist (Clinical Psychologist or LCSW)
- Two hours of group consultation with founder of IH, Dr. Heineman Pieper
- One hour of weekly trainee seminar, comprised of trainees and new staff hires, led by Director of Training, Dr. Tamara Garrity
- Monthly staff meetings and in-service trainings
- Quarterly seminars sponsored by the Intrapsychic Humanism Society
- Weekly Marketing and Group Therapy meetings if applicable

Vacation/Holidays and Sick Days

• 2 weeks of vacation, 8 holidays, and 5 sick days
